How is your Contemplation Zooming?

Before the pandemic my friend Rev. Stuart Higginbotham joked with me how two polar opposite words as Zoom and contemplation could be combined in one experience. He unknowingly predicted the sea change that was coming: our new way we would contemplate together. Our Contemplative Outreach Atlanta members have much to say about our Zooming Centering Prayer experiences:

Zooming changed the landscape from local to worldwide. We are able to embrace our global community without walking out our front door.

- I moved from Atlanta to Texas and still come to every meeting.
- We can join from anywhere in the world.
- It is a blessing to be able to be with fellow Centering Prayer-ers when we wouldn't be able to otherwise.
- We facilitated the Centering Prayer meeting from the Appalachian Trail and from the McDonald's parking lot.
- We can join the meeting on vacation. That would be impossible without Zoom.
- We are able to meet on our lunch hour. I wouldn't be able to drive to the meeting.
- The pandemic has led many new members to Centering Prayer, and Zoom has been a valuable tool to support and welcome our new members.

We are not separated but instantly connected by our one Source, bridged across the miles.

- We relate to each other much more closely.
- It has helped us keep connected. We are present to each other, here and now.
- We have become even closer than before. Because we cannot be together physically, our purpose is strengthened. We have a deeper connection that we didn't know before.
- We can see each other's faces. Instead of seeing the side of everyone's face, we are able to see each person more fully and be able to understand better what they are sharing.
- The Spirit does not separate but unites us in our shared silent consent to God.
- We have become closer to each other than before. Being able to connect has bridged any separation where we relate more deeply heart-to-heart.

We are now invited into each other's homes. We get to know each other more intimately.

- Our bond of mutual love and caring stretches beyond what we could have conceived of earlier.
- I light a candle when we start.
- It has made each one of our homes a chapel. So now we each have a chapel in our homes where we worship and love God, and God is with us all through the days and nights.
- We can turn off our video, be in our jammies, & still be able to pray and share with each other.
- Even our babies and pets can participate.
- We meet loved ones, pets, and children and become part of the family.
- I do miss the hugs, but I am so thankful Zoom has helped me become closer to our friends in our group.

Our Zoom meetings are more focused, more engaged, and more inspiring than before.

- The Holy Spirit is guiding us through our reflections. I feel it from each other.
- It is powerful to be here together in our shared love of God.

- Being in contemplation together in our Zoom meeting is the highlight of my life.

We save time, energy, materials, space, toxic emissions, and aggravation.

- No more lugging of equipment, printing out handouts, reserving rooms.
- No more hassle of bad traffic.
- Weather doesn't keep us from meeting. We don't have to travel in pouring rain/snow/sleet/ice.
