A Taste of Two Thomases

On Saturday, May 15th, Maggie will present her paper "Two Thomases: Merton and Keating Leading Us to Transformation." Here is a taste.

The Desert Fathers and Mothers were the key with which Thomas Merton and Thomas Keating opened a long-shut door to contemplation. Their stories revitalized forgotten ways we can connect to God.

Maggie's trapdoor" experience opened a whole new world for her that changed her life. Plunging into a new way of growing closer to God, her spiritual journey became a brave adventure into new territory that the two Thomases guided.

Both Thomases beckon us to our Beloved in our center through their exquisite recordings of their own experiences. We follow them to transformation. Thomas Keating picks up the torch from Thomas Merton and shows us how we are healed of our human condition through contemplative prayer.

We find them reach unitive consciousness where we want to be also. We learn what that looks like. We pray with them their prayers for the unity of the world.
