Dear Fellow Mystics,



4,000 people attended Contemplative Outreach International's conference where Cynthia Bourgeault presented "Oneness: The Secret Embrace - Thomas Keating's Final Gift to the World" last week from April 30th to May 2nd via Zoom. I am working on typing up the notes; I hope to finalize them when we receive the recordings in a few weeks.

Cynthia clarified Fr. Thomas' final vision of Oneness by revealing how his poems in *The Secret Embrace* were "his final theological outpouring in haiku form." As we examined these poems, she helped us observe Fr. Thomas' documentation of the "final and complete shredding of the self; taking on the combined principal body of

humanity to the collective post of the role he was now playing."

She connected the spare words of Fr. Thomas' poems to illustrate the theological parameters of the landscape of Oneness. We would not be able to plumb the depths of the poems' revelatory meaning without Cynthia's guidance. Poem VII sums it up:

What Matters

Only the Divine matters,

And because the Divine matters,

Everything matters.

Last week I had the privilege of joining OLA's group on Monday, our group Tuesday night, Transfiguration's group Wednesday morning, St. Anthony of Padua's group Wednesday night, our group Thursday afternoon, and Christ Church's group Saturday morning. Everybody, meet Leslie Geer! Born and raised in Denver, Colorado, mother of an almost 30-year-old son, Leslie attended 141-year-old Sacred Heart Catholic Church there growing up. After moving to Atlanta in 1986, she joined St. Anthony of Padua Catholic Church where she served as Director of Faith Based Formation for 10 years. In addition to cantoring in their choir, she leads the St. Anthony of Padua Centering Prayer Group on Wednesday nights and mini retreats on Saturday mornings now by Zoom. Leslie will soon train to become a commissioned presenter of Centering Prayer Workshops in our 2020 Commissioned Presenter Mentor training.

Becoming a contemplative Leslie transitioned from a verbal prayer life into contemplative when her spiritual director guided her using Lectio Divina and eventual resting in God in reflective silence. She has been practicing Centering Prayer for 15 years.

What it's all about "Centering Prayer is about relationships. We want to spend time with someone we are close to, so we make an effort to make our time together meaningful, like cleaning the house and making tea. Here we have someone who knows us, understands us, and loves us most, whom we want to find time to know, understand and love, being comfortable with in the silence.

Don't do this "Don't give up. Persevere. Just accept. Stick with it. Just sit, even on days you think you can't even be still for 15 minutes. Don't give up."

Do this "Be part of a group and share. Others are going through what you are going through too. It is critical to read and delve into *Open Mind*, *Open Heart*."

Community of Saints Leslie felt a powerful presence attending the interspiritual contemplative booksigning on January 12th at Mary and Martha's Place with Rebecca Parker, Lerita Coleman Brown, Stuart Higginbotham, and Carl McColman. She experienced the community of prayer as the community of saints! (Our Revolutionary Contemplatives group is planning a future gathering—physical or virtual, details coming soon.)

Where it all fits "Reflecting back on my life, the Holy Spirit reaches everywhere. Centering Prayer is most beneficial where we accept that God is working in our life, and it is not something we control. If we are just dabbling and not intentional, we miss it. What happens might not look like what we thought it would, but we know everything is going to be ok."

Bet you didn't know After completing a Landmark Forum course in 2015, Leslie started working with Pastor Anita Lane of Jars of Clay Outreach to the homeless. She developed the Handbag Project where people donate gently used handbags filled with socks, toiletries and baby supplies to be given away at Christmas. With Jars of Clay, Seven Bridges to Recovery, Atlanta Missions, Coventry House, Georgia Law Society for the Homeless, and St. Anthony Feed the Hungry, Leslie has distributed thousands of handbags.
